Man Turns Himself In After Alleged Exposure Incident

Hingham, MA – A New Hampshire man turned himself into police from an incident in October in which he allegedly exposed himself to a woman in a restaurant. Police had obtained an arrest warrant shortly after the incident.

On October 23, 2018 at about 11:30am a woman was seated with friends inside the Panera Bread restaurant on Derby Street. A short time later a man sat at a table facing her. The woman reported he then exposed himself to her as he made sexual gestures and stared at her. The man left but a friend who was with the woman got his license plate as he drove away. It was from New Hampshire. Police alerted nearby police departments to look for his vehicle that could be headed toward New Hampshire. After not being able to locate him, police obtained an arrest warrant the following day.

On February 18, 2018 the man turned himself in to the Hingham Police. Arrested in the front lobby was Craig S. Pasco, age 62, of 104 Buffalo Road, Wentworth, NH. He was charged with: 1) Open and Gross Lewdness 2) Disorderly Conduct. He was released after posting \$500.00 cash bail and was arraigned at Hingham District Court on February 19. The bail was ordered to remain in place, he was ordered to have no contact with the victim (who does not know the man) and stay away from the Derby Street Shoppes. He was released to return to court April 2, 2019.
